

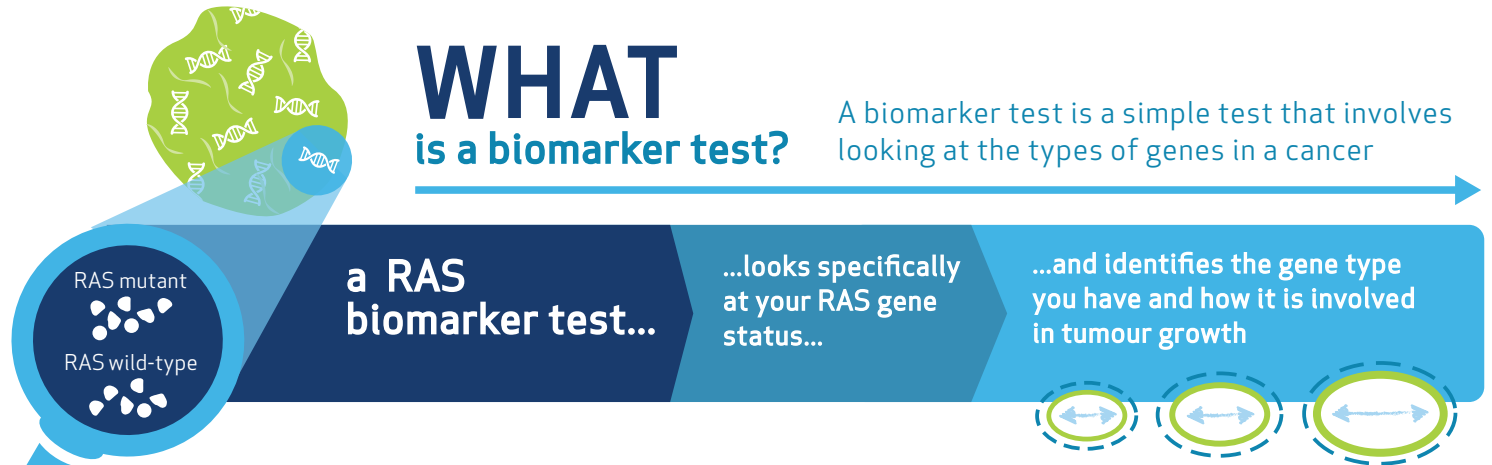

RAS biomarker test¹

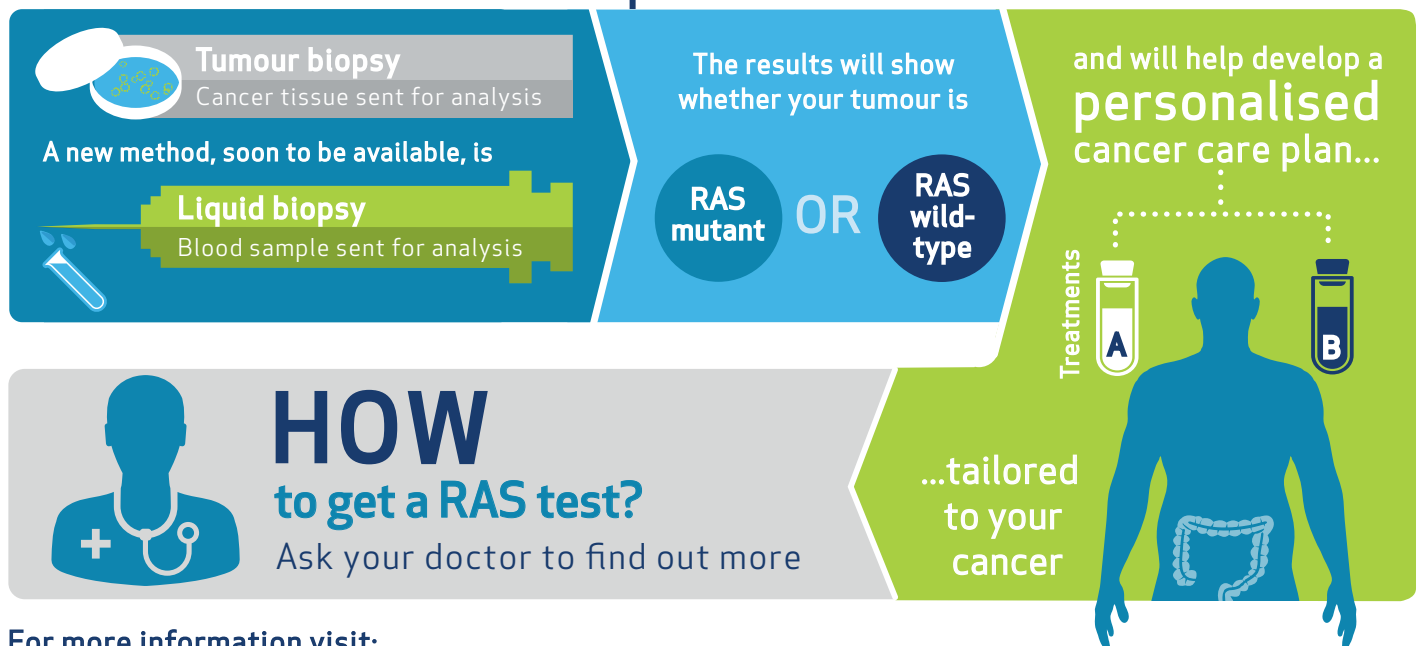
The results of a RAS biomarker test can help select the most appropriate treatment as part of a patients' **personalised treatment plan¹**
