Cancer rehabilitation to reduce disabilities

Italy counts 2 million cancer survivors, with an estimated annual new case rate for 2009-2020 of +12%. According to recent data recorded by Italy's National Social Security Institute (INPS), cancer is a leading cause of disability.

Cancer rehabilitation: from diagnosis to palliative care, a cooperation between care centers and volunteer-based organizations to identify adequate treatment models

In 2003 F.A.V.O. performed the first national survey on cancer rehabilitation centers, which showed rehabilitation was an unrecognized right for numerous cancer survivors, especially in Southern Italy.

As a result, a project was designed to gain insight into cancer rehabilitation needs and treatment offers nationwide, and also to show that a multidisciplinary approach would be of great benefit.
