A report from the **World Economic Forum** in partnership with the **Lung Ambition Alliance** has just been launched: *Learning lessons from across Europe* – *prioritising lung cancer after COVID-19.* **Charis Chirvalaki**, **EU Affairs Manager from ECPC has contributed** to this report which can be read here.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a dramatic impact on the early detection of lung and other cancers. It has exacerbated some of the existing challenges people faced in being diagnosed with lung cancer.

Even prior to the pandemic, there was an **urgent need to take action** to improve lung cancer outcomes across Europe. The COVID-19 pandemic has heightened this need; but potentially also provided **opportunities for lessons to be learnt** that could be adopted in the longer term. MyPaI is a H2020 EUfunded project that aims to enable both adults and children with cancer who require palliative care to report physical and emotional symptoms via an app using Patient Reported Outcomes.

Their healthcare team monitor their input via a web portal on a **digital** health platform.

This enables prompt identification of important deviations in patients' health and Quality of Life and allows healthcare providers to focus on their specific needs empowering patients and their families to actively participate in their disease management.
