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

Patient briefing sheet on pan-tumor treatments



Following last year's launch of 'Investing in the Future', a White Paper calling for greater access to cancer biomarker testing, ECPC is pleased to have been involved in the development of a complementary briefing fact sheet, focusing on pan-tumor therapies and their role in redefining cancer care.

Created together with a team of medical and patient advocacy experts from institutions such as the Oncohealth Institute and Fight Bladder Cancer, the briefing sheet is a visual and concise resource that explores the benefits of pan-tumor treatments for both patients and healthcare systems. It is designed for use both as an educational tool for patients and as an advocacy tool to support access discussions with HTA bodies.

Ageing and cancer: do you know any best practices that you can share with us?



- ECPC has contributed to the work done by the King Baudouin Foundation on how to
 best involve cancer patients in research. Take a look to the report, "Towards a highperformance oncology research system" and the leaflet "Oncology research for optimal
 patient value A systems approach".
- The <u>TrilynX Clinical Trial</u> is a study that combines chemotherapy and radiotherapy in patients with locally advanced squamous cell carcinoma of the head and neck. This trial launch follows the positive phase II results observed at 3-year follow-up analysis showing superior and statistically significant locoregional control, progression-free survival and overall survival vs. the placebo control group.
